CITIZEN'S CHARTER

This Charter seeks to provide a framework which enables our users to know about the activities of the Council and related links and a platform to redress their grievances:-

About the Council:-

Central Council of Homoeopathy is a statutory body of Govt. of India, Ministry of AYUSH, constituted under an Act of Parliament namely, Homoeopathy Central Council Act, 1973(59th of 1973).

President of India promulgated the Homoeopathy Central Council (Amendment) Ordinance, 2018 on the 18th day of May, 2018, (which came into force on the said date) and in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (4) of section 3A of the H.C.C. Act, 1973 the Central Govt. constituted the Board of Governors on the same date consisting of the following Members, namely:-

Objects of Central Council of Homoeopathy:-

- 1. To prescribe minimum standards of education in Homoeopathy.
- 2. To recommend to Central Govt. for permission of opening of new colleges, increase of seats and starting of new or higher courses.
- 3. To advise/recommend to Central Government for recognition or withdrawal of recognition of medical qualifications in Homoeopathy.
- 4. To negotiate with the authority in any State or Country entrusted with maintenance of a Register of Homoeopathic Practitioners for settling a scheme of reciprocity for recognition of medical qualifications in Homoeopathy.
- 5. To maintain the Central Register of Homoeopathy.
- 6. To prescribe standards of professional conduct, etiquette and code of ethics to be observed by the Homoeopathic practitioners.

Educational Regulations prescribed by CCH:-

Central Council has prescribed various educational regulations for U.G. and P.G. level education in Homoeopathy and same can be seen/downloaded from its website. There is no Diploma or certificate course in Homoeopathy now. Minimum course is Degree Course namely, BHMS of 5½ years duration including one year compulsory internship training. BHMS course is regulated by Homoeopathy (Degree Course) Regulations, 1983. There is a BHMS graded degree course of two years duration which is prescribed in Homoeopathy (Graded Degree Course) Regulations, 1983. Post Graduate Degree Courses are available too in seven speciality subjects. There is no correspondence/distance course in Homoeopathy.

Homoeopathic Medical Colleges:-

Presently the authority to approve a Homoeopathic Medical College is vested with Central Govt. Status of approval to a Homoeopathic Medical College can be checked with Central Council.

Inspection of Colleges/Examinations:-

Central Council carryout inspection of colleges as well as of examinations in order to assess the standards of various institutions imparting training for Undergraduate and/ or Post-graduate degree courses.

Recognised medical qualifications:-

Medical qualifications in Homoeopathy awarded in India and abroad, if included in the Second or the Third Schedule to HCC Act,1973 are the recognized qualifications which can be seen at the CCH website.

Central Register of Homoeopathy:-

Central Council maintains a register known as Central Register of Homoeopathy (CRH) in Part-1 for qualified practitioners and in Part-II for practitioners registered on experience basis in the State Boards/Councils. A person whose name is enrolled in the CRH is eligible to practice in any part of the Country subject to the provisions of sections 15 & 26 of HCC Act, 1973 but in case of change of address, one has to inform the change in address within 03 months to the respective State Board/Council where she/he is registered as well as to CCH.

Preparation and maintenance of the Central Register is a continuous exercise based upon the data provided by the State Boards/Councils. A list of such State Boards/Councils is available at the CCH website.

Direct Registration with CCH:-

Although Direct Registration with CCH is optional but if any qualified registered practitioner desires to obtain registration certificate from CCH, she/he can apply in Form 'A' with all relevant documents as indicated on CCH website. Form 'A' can be downloaded.

Addition of higher qualification:-

A qualified practitioner of homoeopathy who is directly registered with CCH, can apply in Form 'B' which is available on CCH website for additional qualification with prescribed fees alongwith relevant documents as reflected in Registration Regulations.
