Sub. : Interim orders passed by various Hon’ble High Courts to admit students subject to result of Writ Petition – Reg.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to inform you that approximately 100 ASU (Ayurveda, Siddha & Unani) and 44 Homeopathic colleges are denied permission for the academic year 2019-20. Many colleges have challenged the denial order of the Ministry by filing writ petition in their respective High courts and succeeded to get interim relief to admit students subject to result of the Writ Petition. In several court cases (for eg : WP 112513/19 Dhanwantari Ayurveda college & Hospital, Siddhapur, Karnataka at High Court of Karnataka, Dharwad Bench) Hon’ble High Courts directed to inform the students that their admissions are subject to final outcome of Writ Petition. If the petition is dismissed, the students cannot claim equity. Accordingly, students have been reportedly admitted in the non-permitted colleges subject to result of the petition.

2. To secure admission in AYUSH courses, NEET Examination for UG & AIAPGET for PG are mandatory as per the Relevant Regulations. However, some of the colleges and Associations had approached High Courts to admit students other than NEET qualified candidates on the grounds that lots of seats are reportedly vacant.

3. The Central Council of Indian Medicine has filed a SLP (C) No. 25464 of 2019 against the order dated 20.09.2019 allowing the admission of students other than NEET qualified passed by the High Court of Karnataka at Bengaluru in I.A. No.1 of 2019 in WPNo.41486 of 2018 and the Hon’ble Supreme Court of India vide order dated 04.11.2019

Rishi Jaiswal

was pleased to stay the order of High Courts of Karnataka till further order. The Ministry has also filed SLP No.26267 of 2019 before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India against the order dated 06.09.2019 passed by the High Court of Punjab & Haryana in CWP No.23710 of 2019.

4. In view of the above, you are requested to ensure that the students whose admission are in pursuance to the interim order of Hon'ble High Courts subject to result of writ petition may be suitably informed as per the direction of concerned Courts. If any deviation is noticed, it may be informed to the Ministry of AYUSH by 10th of December 2019.
